# **Audition Info**

- Auditions are by appointment only and are held in thirty minute increment groups. Appointments can be made by calling 619-239-1311.
- Please arrive at least 15 mins prior to your assigned time slot. Make sure you have completed the online Audition Form with a current headshot uploaded. Scan QR code on reverse for form.
- Students should prepare a 1 minute cut of a song.
- Please wear comfortable clothing you can move in and secure, closed-toe shoes to both Auditions and Callbacks.

### **Eligibility**

- Students must be enrolled in a SUMMER CAMP prior to auditioning. Students not registered will not be allowed to audition.
- Students must be age 8-18 by Opening Night [Jun 27], and have their <u>crew credit</u> up to date, prior to scheduling an audition slot.

### **Production Fee**

- There is a \$125 Production Fee for Cast Members and a \$75 Fee for Crew Members. Production Fees are due by Opening Night.
- Included with this fee, students will receive a production t-shirt, pizza dinner on opening, a headshot button (logo button for crew), 1 admittance to strike dinner, memory book and digital access to production photos

### **Parent Volunteers**

### **Cast of Characters**

YOUNG SIMBA: The protagonist of the story, an adventurous and endearing cub who can't wait to be king of the Pridelands. Simba is playful, energetic, and naive, but after his father Mufasa's death, Simba struggles with shame and his destiny.

SIMBA: Grows from a cub to a lion in "Hakuna Matata." Older Simba has more complex moments as he reunites with Nala, mourns his father, and returns to confront Scar.

YOUNG NALA: A courageous lion and Young Simba's best friend. She is not afraid to speak her mind.

NALA: Like Young Nala, she is a courageous lion who grows from a cub to a lioness before she confronts Scar.

SHENZI: One of Scar's hyenas who plot to take over the Pridelands. She is the sassy one of the trio and is always looking out for herself.

BANZAI: A slick yet childish hyena who works for Scar. He would be the leader of the group if hyenas weren't so lazy.

ED: The third member of Scar's trio of lackeys. He has a loud, cackling laugh that is his only form of communication.

TIMON: An outcast meerkat who lives in the jungle with Pumbaa. He is afraid of his own shadow, but pretends to be the confident, relaxed leader of the duo.

PUMBAA: A kindhearted, sensitive warthog who enjoys his simple life of grubs and relaxation. He's a loveable and loyal friend to Timon and Simba with deadpan humor.

ENSEMBLE: The ensemble plays various inhabitants of the Pridelands, such as hyenas, lionesses, giraffes, elephants, antelopes, and wildebeests.
