

- Please arrive at least 15 mins prior to your assigned time slot. Make sure you have completed the online Audition Form with a current headshot uploaded. Scan QR code on reverse for form.
- Students should prepare a 1 minute cut of a song.
- Please wear comfortable clothing you can move in and secure, closed-toe shoes to both Auditions and Callbacks.

# **Eligibility**

- Students must be enrolled in a SUMMER CAMP prior to auditioning. Students not registered will not be allowed to audition.
- Students must be age 12-18 by Opening Night [Jul 25], and have their <u>crew credit</u> up to date, prior to scheduling an audition slot.

### **Production Fee**

- There is a \$125 Production Fee for Cast Members and a \$75 Fee for Crew Members. Production Fees are due by Opening Night.
- Included with this fee, students will receive a production t-shirt, pizza dinner on opening, a headshot button (logo button for crew), 1 admittance to strike dinner, memory book and digital access to production photos
