## Audition Info

- Auditions are by appointment only and are held in thirty minute increment groups. Appointments can be made by calling 619-239-1311.
- Please arrive at least 15 mins early to your assigned time slot with your Audition Form completely filled out, front and back with a current headshot. Parent/Guardian section must be completed and signed prior to submitting form.
- Students should prepare a 1-minute song that best showcases their personality. An accompanist will be provided.
- Please wear comfortable clothing you can move in and secure, closed-toe shoes to both Auditions and Callbacks.

## Eligibility

- Students must be enrolled in a SUMMER CAMP prior to auditioning. Students not registered will not be allowed to audition.
- Students must be age 13-18 by Opening Night [July 26], and have their crew credit up to date, prior to scheduling an audition slot.

## Production Info

### **Production Fee**

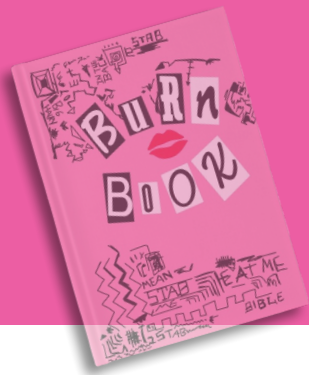
- There is a \$125 Production Fee for Cast Members and a \$75 Fee for Crew Members. Production Fees are due by Opening Night.
- Included with this fee, students will receive a production t-shirt, pizza dinner on opening, a headshot button (logo button for crew), 1 admittance to strike dinner, memory book and digital access to production photos

### **Parent Volunteers**

- No production here at JT would be possible without the time and assistance of our parent volunteers. As such, we do require each student's parents or guardians to sign up for a minimum number of volunteer slots over the course of the production. Details on volunteer opportunities will be shared by your Parent Chair(s) at the start of rehearsals.

## **Conflicts**

- It is very important that you list ALL conflicts on the audition form. This includes JT Classes/Camps, school events, sports, appointments, vacations, etc. Any conflicts that arise that were not listed prior to casting may not be approved or may result in student being dismissed from the production.
- Students cannot have any conflicts during Tech Rehearsals or for any Performance dates to be eligible for casting.

## Characters

**Cady:** A new junior at North Shore High School, Cady grew up in Africa and was homeschooled by her wildlife biologist parents. She is warm, bright, and strong enough to take on the Plastics.

**Regina:** Queen Bee of the Plastics. When she shines her light on you, you feel like the most important person in the world. When that light goes cold, you want to die.

**Janis:** An “Art Freak” and social outcast, Janis is not afraid to be weird or make others uncomfortable. She paints herself as an objective observer, but, like so many of us, she longs to avenge the devastating events of eighth grade.

**Damian:** Outgoing and an active member of the student activities committee, Damian is a fiercely loyal friend to Janis and they have the close rapport of a comedy team.

**Gretchen:** One of the Plastics. Desperate to please Regina and to maintain her position in the Plastics, Gretchen is a nervous wreck.

**Karen:** One of the Plastics. Although her intellect and personality never had a chance to develop, Karen is essentially kind, relaxed and a generous laughter.

**Aaron:** A cute boy with a good moral compass and a backbone. He’s not immune to all the female attention he gets, but he’s not going to let himself be a pawn in their chess game either.

**Mrs. Heron:** Cady’s intellectual mom who can’t understand why her daughter is devolving before her eyes.

**Ms. Norbury:** Cady’s world-weary Calculus teacher who pushes Cady to be her smartest self.

**Mrs. George:** Regina’s “cool mom.” She’s desperate to look young and feel like one of the teens.
